

Pupil Premium Funding 2024

The school's strategy for Pupil Premium Funding is to spend the allocated funds to support pupils progress and attainment with interventions, extra-curricular activities alongside Quality First Teaching in order that the pupils reach Age Related Expectations.

In 2023-2024 the school received £5660

Barriers to the educational achievement faced by pupils eligible for Pupil Premium Funding are:

- parental engagement with school
- pupils and families with specific social, emotional and behavioural needs which affect pupils learning
- pupils on the SEND register in addition to being eligible for Pupil Premium Funding
- access to extra-curricular activities

The funding will be used in the following ways to provide support for the children:

- Financial support in order to be able to participate in school trips, residential trips and after school clubs such as sport and music
- Daily reading support with a teacher or Learning Support Assistant
- Quality First Teaching
- Small group support with a teacher or Learning Support Assistant
- One to one online tuition
- One to one support with a teacher or Learning Support Assistant
- One to one support with the school's Nurture Assistant
- Sports coaching
- Foundry College and in school nurture support.

The funding will be used in this way as historical evidence proves this has positive impact on children's outcomes.

We will measure the impact on an on-going basis and half termly basis tracking data, through lesson observations, learning walks, drop ins, through the scrutiny of pupils books and by discussing with children/families their support in school.

Total impact of this year's funding will be measured at year end and reported to our Full Governing Body.
